Stephen Hilgartner is Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of Science & Technology Studies in the College of Arts & Sciences. His research examines the social dimensions and politics of contemporary and emerging science and technology, especially in the biosciences. Hilgartner is a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. Last fall, he served on the Provost's Committee on a Cornell School of Public Policy.

Recent publications include "Intellectual Property and the Politics of Emerging Technology" (*Chicago-Kent Law Review*, 2010), "Staging High-Visibility Science: Media Orientation in Genome Research," (*Sociology of the Sciences Yearbook*, 2011), and "Selective Flows of

Knowledge in Technoscientific Interaction" (*British Journal for History of Science*, in press). His book *Science on Stage: Expert Advice as Public Drama* won the Carson Prize from the Society for Social Studies of Science.
