(I explained on the previous page that, despite giving a shorter, easier final to allow for a small amount of time for grading, I almost didn't make the deadline after working flat out.) Moving winter break to a mid-spring break might not be a bad idea.

## Why the same question?

I don't see why moving the order of the two breaks is a good idea The spring break is not too late, and I don't see why coordinating spring breaks with schools that start much earlier is so important.

This should be based on general student valuation and, particularly, input from Spring athletes and coaches. Our teams do sacrifice a lot, already, with the early (for Ithaca climate) Spring schedule.

Even though I don't have kids, might be nice for spring break to coincide with Ithaca-area spring breaks so CU members with families can take a vacation. Starting semester on a Thursday means students won't actually return to campus until the following week.

Spring break in early March is weird, but it could work.

Reversing the breaks seems to be less disruptive and give students a break when they need it. They still don't match with secondary school breaks. Shorter exam study period seems better

I don't have strong feeling either way about the variations in the S2 schedule. I agree, in all new possible scenarios presented, that study/exam period can be reduced. Switching the order between winter and spring break seems plausible to try

Appears to maximize child care issues.

The notion of switching the breaks is interesting; students do feel tremendous pressure in the weeks prior to our current spring break and clearly have some difficulty "making it" until then.

unclear what the best placement of week-long spring break would be for students

Reverse order of two breaks is an interesting idea and would lend itself well to the semester academic goals. However, Spring break would not really feel like "Spring break" since it'd still be wintry.

Either is fine for me.

## Seems the same

I find it more reasonable to have a short break first and reserve a week-long spring break for when the semester is starting to weight a lot on all of us (students and faculty). But in all fairness, this schedule is more reasonable in terms of scheduling prelims (the rule that work should not be requested of students during the break is a killer for scheduling prelims). This option, though, is even worse in terms of families with children.

It is a long haul from spring break to the end.

It is pointless to move around the 2 day break - these are such a waste of effort since they are routinely disregarded.

I think the one week break later in the semester makes a bigger difference for the students. On the faculty caregiver side, might we consider matching the two days break in April with the public school break. For 2016 and 2017, the school week long break followed the Christian holiday of Easter Sunday. However in 2014 the kids' spring break preceded Easter Sunday. I don't know if they have switched or if it changes year by year. Might the committee inquire about this.

Personally I think the current Spring break dates make more sense, but I don't think this is too bad either.

I feel having a long break so early in the semester won't balance the weeks well, but I could see it working either way.

Better in some respects but Spring Break would seem to come awfully early.

By mid-March or April, one is really fried (whether student or faculty) and the Spring break is very very welcome. But it might have less of an effect earlier on, when one isn't quite fried enough.

This might work but the breaks do no coincide with anything at the grade to high school level. So anyone with children don't get to take advantage of the time. Other than that, it preserves the time in the winter break that will allow for the international study trips that are routinely conducted in the period.

Spring break will be more in line with other universities however the later two day break in April will still make scheduling classes/exams/assignments difficult

Spring semester still ends too late for biologists conducting field work.

I agree that the current February break is early, but the solution to that seems to be to postpone by one week. S2 just switches the long and unbroken period to an earlier time in the semester, which doesn't help a lot.

It's important to have 2 breaks but it'd be nice to have a longer break (spring) later, when it's spring. Preferred S1.

February break works better in first option.

START EARLIER, don't shrink the finals week.

it may be better to start a semester one week earlier so that students can attend internship better.

This is a better option than S1 in that it ensures an equal number of instruction days for both the MW & TR classes. I also think 27 - [5] - 23 - [2] - 19 class day streaks, with a longer break coming first, might provide a more effective rhythm for instruction.

The "long" break is too early

I'm unsure whether an entire week of break prior to the middle of the term would seem too much too soon. I'm unsure about the small relief (2 days in April) during a 9-week stretch of the semester. (In my view, the second half of the spring semester is the most difficult stretch of the academic year.)

Neither break overlaps with public school breaks and is therefore not family friendly. S2 would be better if second break was coordinated with school break.

An improvement, but Spring break too early. We don't need a 2 day break in April!

Addresses problem of long break being too late in the semester. However, further lengthening winter break seems to go in the wrong direction.

No signfiliacnt differences

The summer is too short. Move august days to December. Don't start classes on a Thursday. Two day break is disruptive to schedule. 1 day break is worse. Full week Thanksgiving break is good.
