Members at large shall be elected by members of the UF* and RTE* faculty by mail ballot, in accordance with procedures established by the Committee on Nominations and Elections, from among candidates nominated by the Committee on Nominations and Elections.  Individual colleges are responsible for the election of at-large RTE senators. Any member of the college RTE* faculty is free to place their name on the slate. The electorate must include all tenured, tenure track, and RTE* faculty in the college.  2. Other elected members shall be elected by each constituency to fill the number of seats assigned to that constituency. Elections shall be by secret ballot. All members of the UF* and RTE* faculty shall be eligible to vote in a constituency election. The voting faculty members of a constituency may allow other members of that constituency to take part in the Senate election. Each constituency must have at least one senator who is a member of the UF*. A
	constituency with two seats can elect to the Senate a member of the RTE* faculty.
