# A.D. White Professors-at-Large Selection Committee Activities and Formal Campus Visits PART I

#### INTRODUCTION

The Selection Committee welcomed back Professor David Feldshuh (Performing and Media Arts) for his fourth year as Program Chair for the 2019-20 academic year. The Program Chair plays an integral role in overseeing the activities of the Committee to nominate and select new Professors-at-Large each year. Likewise, the Chair's involved with communications and attending meetings with all faculty hosts scheduled for academic year visits.

This year's meetings were held on September 27, 2019; November 19, 2019; and February 28, 2020, respectively.

The 2019-2020 activities of the Selection Committee were focused on the annual Call for Nominations initiative requiring three meetings to convene over the course of the past year, involving a robust effort in generating new nominations. There were no Professor-at-Large retirements in June, 2020.

#### A.D. WHITE PROFESSORS-AT-LARGE SELECTION COMMITTEEE: STRUCTURE

The 13-member The A.D. White Professors-at-Large Selection Committee includes four members who hold the title of *ex officio* including: Program Chair, Dean of Students, Dean of the Graduate School, and the Dean of Faculty. The membership of the Committee is overseen by the Faculty Senate Nominations and Elections Committee, who select and approve faculty members to hold three-year terms (two-term limit - 6 years) on the ADW PAL Selection Committee. In 2018-2019, there was full membership with no outstanding vacancies which has been the case over several years prior. The Nominations and Elections Committee works to make certain that representation on the committee is reflective of a wide range of Colleges and academic departments (arts, humanities, life sciences, social sciences, physical sciences— alone and in various combinations) across the entire campus.

The Committee reviewed upcoming vacancies to be addressed this year with Gerard Aching, Rebecca Nelson, and Barbara Knuth retiring their seats. The replacements for next year are Marilyn Migiel (Romance) and Jeremy Wallace (Government).

Current Selection Committee members Cornelia Farnum and Michael Schuler have graciously agreed to continue for a second three-year term, respectively.

It should be noted that since Barbara Knuth steps down as Dean of the Graduate School in June 2020, her successor will then assume the Committee role.
