Some comments from the 12/6 Meeting

- 1. The literacy and DEI "halves" of the requirement will evolve over time.
- 2. The Kendi book has a strong historical flavor and should be part of the literacy component.
- 3. No such thing as "unracist". One is either racist or antiracist.
- 4. The focus should be on the US situation with global connections only as needed.
- 5. Should not allow students to count courses taken at other schools to satisfy the requirement.
- 6. The requirement is meant to be disruptive of student schedule.
- 7. The idea of having a "check out" video library with antiracist material has broad support.

 Properties: Unfiltered, maintained by "the Center", regularly updated, a list of classroom talking points should be supplied with each video. Prperlyorganized, would be a vehcle for embedding antiracist content across the curriculum.
- 8. Settled on the following list of units to create the required course: Africana, AIISP, LAS, FGSS, AAS.
- 9. To be an antiracist requires a certain level of confidence. The DEI and literacy components contribute to that in different ways.
- 10. Faculty pushback is intense when a new requirement "pushes out" an existing valued requirement.
