We had planned for the entire meeting to be devoted to the **university's financial crisis** with a double presentation: Provost + FPC

President and Provost felt that the timing was inappropriate given the level of angst in the Cornell community relating to **national events**. They proposed a one-week delay.

UFC unanimously felt that the **two topics** are related and advocated from a shared governance point of view that we should proceed with the financial discussion suitably framed by current events.

The FPC felt 6-to-4 that it was better to appear jointly with the Provost on June 10 given assurances that there would be no decision made until after that date.
