A.D. White Professors-at-Large Selection Committee Activities and Formal Campus Visits

PART I

INTRODUCTION

The Selection Committee welcomed Dr. Robert S. Weiss (Department of Biomedical Sciences) as Program Chair starting July 1, 2021, following the conclusion of Professor David Feldshuh's (Department of Performing and Media Arts) tenure as Chair for five years. The Program Chair plays an integral role in overseeing the activities of the Committee to nominate and select new Professors-at-Large each year. Likewise, the Chair is involved with communications and attending meetings with all faculty hosts scheduled for academic year visits.

This year's Selection Committee meetings were held on September 30, 2021; December 16, 2021; and March 11, 2022.

The 2021-22 activities of the Selection Committee were focused on the annual Call for Nominations initiative requiring three meetings to convene over the course of the past year, involving a robust effort in generating new nominations. There were three Professors-at-Large whose appointments ended June 30, 2022: Andrew Dobson (Life Sciences); Wynton Marsalis (Arts); and Margaret Martonosi (Physical Sciences).

A.D. WHITE PROFESSORS-AT-LARGE SELECTION COMMITTEEE: STRUCTURE

The 13-member The A.D. White Professors-at-Large Selection Committee includes four members who hold the title of ex officio including: Program Chair, Dean of Students, Dean of the Graduate School, and the Dean of Faculty. The membership of the Committee is overseen by the Faculty

Senate Nominations and Elections Committee, who select and approve faculty members to hold three-year terms (two-term limit - 6 years) on the ADW-PAL Selection Committee. In 2021-22, there was full membership with no outstanding vacancies which has been the case over several years prior. The Nominations and Elections Committee works to make certain that representation on the committee is reflective of a wide range of Colleges and academic departments (arts, humanities, life sciences, social sciences, physical sciences - alone and in various combinations) across the entire campus.

The Committee reviewed the upcoming vacancies to be addressed with Leslie Adelson (Department of German Studies) and Michael Shuler (Department of Biomedical Sciences) retiring their seats.

New Committee members are Lorenzo Alvisi (Department of Computer Science); Steve Jackson (Department of Information Science); Lisa Kaltenegger (Department of Astronomy); and John Lis (Department of Molecular Biology and Genetics), who have each been selected to serve a three-year term beginning July 1, 2022.

Current Selection Committee member Bruce Levitt (Department of Performing and Media Arts) has graciously agreed to continue for an additional term.

A.D. WHITE PROFESSORS-AT-LARGE: PROCESS

Of the six pre-proposals that were initially submitted, 4 were favorably reviewed, leading to requests for full nomination submissions. Of the 4 full nominations, the following 2 full proposal nominations were selected in February 2022 and invited to move forward for consideration for Professor-at-Large appointments. Subsequently, these candidates were approved at the May 2022 Board of Trustees meeting:

A.D. WHITE PROFESSORS-AT-LARGE VISITS AND ACTIVITIES

The Program schedules, plans, implements, and evaluates formal campus visits by Professors-at-Large throughout the academic year. The program is in the process of working with faculty hosts to plan the visits for fall 2022 and spring 2023.

A.D. WHITE PROFESSOR-AT-LARGE MINI-VISITS

To help address the backlog of visits in need of scheduling due to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, the ADW-PAL program has created a new 'mini' visit mechanism. An ADW-PAL 'mini' visit is structured as a one-time, 1-2 day visit that brings the ADW-PAL to the Cornell campus in coordination with the faculty host's academic department. Each on-site 'mini' visit must include at least one public event (lecture, performance, etc). Alternatively, this mechanism may be used to support a virtual 'mini' visit featuring a professionally-produced recording of the ADW-PAL, such as an interview or reading, created to share with and engage the Cornell community. The ADW-PAL 'mini' visit will serve to keep current ADW-PAL and their respective faculty hosts satisfied and engaged with the ADW-PAL Program during this time. The 'mini' visit does not substitute for or replace either of the two standard week-long visits that ADW-PAL are expected to make during their appointment. In addition, these visits are optional. All current ADW-PAL hosts have been offered the option of arranging a mini-visit.

A.D. WHITE PROFESSOR-AT-LARGE WEBSITE

The ADW-PAL website is undergoing a site redesign through the Cornell CIT Project Management Office. This project is being undertaken to modernize the website to bring it in-line with current standards and to provide a more effective platform to share information about the program, Professors-at Large, and events. The redesigned website is scheduled to launch at the beginning of the 2022-23 academic year.
