## Annual Report, University Faculty Library Board, 2021–22

The Faculty Library Board (FLB) held six regular meetings during the 2021/22 academic year and additionally met twice during summer 2021 and three times during the 2022 winter session.

Ravi Ramakrishna (Arts & Sciences) and Claudia Leon (undergrad representative, Arts & Sciences) joined the board this year. Continuing board members include Eilyan Bitar (Engineering), Jeremy Braddock (Arts & Sciences), Nancy Chau (Business/Arts & Sciences), Abby Cohn (Arts & Sciences), J. Ellen Gainor (Arts & Sciences), Karim-Aly Kassam (Arts & Sciences), Karen Levy (Computing and Information Science), Alec Pollak (grad representative, Arts & Sciences), Chantal Thomas (Law School), Rachel Weil (Arts & Sciences), Max Zhang (Engineering), and Warren Zipfel (Engineering), along with co-chairs Andrew Hicks (Arts & Sciences) and Ellis Loew (Veterinary Medicine). The Library was represented by Judy Appleton (Senior Vice Provost) and Kizer Walker (Director of Collections).

A key standing agenda item at nearly all meetings was the then ongoing and now successfully concluded Carl A. Kroch University Librarian search. In early July the FLB met with consultants from Isaacson, Miller to discuss the search and help shape the parameters and profile of the potential pool of candidates. To ensure broad faculty representation in that discussion, the board invited former members and other faculty with significant investments in CUL to join us (Isaacson, Miller hosted similar "listening sessions" with other constituencies across the Library and the University). Later in July the FLB met with Deputy Provost John Siliciano and Vice Provost for Academic Innovation Julia Thom-Levy, co-chairs of the search committee, who also provided regular if necessarily minimalist updates throughout the search process. During the last weeks of January, the FLB met with the three UL finalists, which was the primary opportunity for the candidates to engage with members of the University faculty. Following those meetings, board members provided individual feedback to the search committee, and on February 2, 2022, the FLB met to discuss the search. Based on that discussion, the co-chairs submitted collective feedback on behalf of the FLB to the search committee.

In addition to its engagement in the UL search, the board reserved regular time for updates from the Task Force on Library Research Infrastructure (TFLRI), which was appointed in Spring 2021 by Vice President for Research Emmanuel Giannelis and University Librarian Gerald Beasley to consider the infrastructure that researchers in all disciplines at Cornell will need from the Library over the next decade. The TFLRI presented a draft of its final report at the March 2022 FLB meeting.

After nearly two years of COVID-inflected agendas, the FLB welcomed the opportunity to reengage with and advise on long-standing and emerging Library projects and priorities. These included: (1) the recent migration to FOLIO, a new open source library services platform; (2) the 2021 Faculty Library Survey (which had been postponed in 2020 owing to the pandemic); (3) "Big Deal" licensing agreements and the imperative for clear and transparent communication and consultation regarding their renewal; (4) the future of Rare and Distinctive (RAD) Collections and new scholarly engagement initiatives spearheaded by Joan Lubin (Director of Research, Education, and Engagement for Rare and Distinctive Collections); (5) the Cornell Academic Materials Program (CAMP); (6) the Anti-Racism and Library Collection Development Report (commissioned by the Collection Development Executive Committee); and (7) the activities of Cornell University Press and future opportunities for expanding its collaborations with the Library (in discussion with Jane Bunker, Director of Cornell University Press).
