However, he made them off campus in the capacity of a private citizen. On October 17, you, as President of Cornell University in a formal capacity, along with “the senior leadership of the Board of Trustees,” condemned Professor Rickford’s remarks, adding that: “The university is taking this incident seriously and is currently reviewing it consistent with our procedures.” No one who read that statement could not fail to see that the central administration was warning Professor Rickford that he might be formally punished for his remarks.

Given that the central administration’s statement might have been motivated, in part, by an emotional reaction to events in Israel and Palestine, would the central administration now consider revoking the October 17 statement and, in that way, renewing its commitment to free speech and academic freedom?
